On the Move: Transport and Travel!



Spring Term 2 2020

Communication and Language (listening and attention, understanding, speaking)

At the start of the term the children will think about what they already know about travel and transport and what they want to find out. Children will be given the chance to listen and respond to ideas expressed by others. They will listen to stories and will have the opportunity to act them out in the role play area. Using 'The Gingerbread Man' story, they will explore changing parts of the story and acting this out. The children will continue to sit quietly during whole class and smaller group led activities

Mathematics (number, shape, space and measure)- White Rose Maths Mastery

Children will begin by exploring addition through combining groups to find the whole. They will use objects and progress to using a whole-part model to solve addition calculations. Children will find pairs of numbers that make ten using objects and a tens frame. They will use positional language, name and describe both 3D and 2D shapes.

Understanding the World (People and Communities, World, Technology)

Children will learn about the uses, features and types of transport. They will learn to recognise the changes in transport from the past to the present focusing mainly on cars, boat and aeroplanes. Children will learn the new vocabulary associated with each mode of transport. The children will explore spring and the changes that are happening comparing these changes from the previous season. Children will continue to use a range of technology for different purposes.

Physical Development (moving and handling, health and self-care)

The children will be learning ball and racket skills to enable them to play a game of tennis. Linked to our topic of transport they will explore moving in different ways. Children will continue to develop their gross and fine motor skills in their everyday play and when cutting, writing and when creating artwork. The children will continue to have access to the outdoor play equipment to develop their gross motor skills.

Spring 2- 2020 On the Move: Travel and Transport!

Expressive Arts and Design (Exploring Media and Materials and Being Imaginative)

Children will explore different styles of line and study the work of Miro. They will design and make boats, wheeled vehicles and Easter Bonnets. The children will be using different media and materials to explore colour, shape and ways of joining junk modelling materials along with various collage techniques. They will take part in weekly music making sessions learning songs and exploring tuned percussion instruments.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development (Self-confidence and self-awareness, managing relationships, managing feelings and behaviour)

Children will continue to think about the class room rules and building upon the friendships within the class. They will be focusing on their own actions and the feelings of other children. Children will learn to recognise and identity these feelings in themselves and others. They will explore what causes different feelings and begin to recognise how change can affect themselves and others in different ways. Children will consider ways of making themselves and other people feel better.

Literacy (writing, reading and phonics)



The children will focus on writing sentences using a capital letter, fingers spaces and a full stop at the end. They will be encouraged to form their letters correctly and neatly. They will create their own story maps of 'The Gingerbread Man' and then write their own version of the story. Children will explore different types of writing including stories, settings, descriptions, instructions and labelling.



Reading

Children will take part in weekly individual reading with the class teacher or class teaching assistant. As a whole class we will be reading lots of stories together, some that link into our topic and others for enjoyment. Children will be taught the meaning of new words and be given the opportunity to read out aloud.



In our daily phonics lessons we will continue to learn new sounds and practise segmenting to read and to spell new words. Please see the weekly Newsletter for the sounds each group will be learning.

🥮 Religious Education

The children will take part in a Pancake Race as an introduction to Lent. They will learn the reasons why Christians put a cross in the Easter Garden and learn about the different objects and symbols associated with Easter.
