

This term we will continue to prepare for the SATS and transition into year 7.





English

As budding writers, we will be learning about the following assorted styles of writing and authors:

Modern Fiction

We will explore the popular text 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo providing inspiration for the use and development of higher-level language and cohesion within and between paragraphs.

As readers, we will be evaluating a wider range of texts using 'Book Talk' and we will continue to read our class novel together, 'The Curse of the Maya'.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will consolidate our understanding of ratio and proportion and further develop our use of equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages. We will continue to investigate problems involving properties of shape and begin to explore algebra.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

French – As linguists, we will continue our French lessons with Madame Kernick.

Science - As scientists, we will be learning about famous scientists and inventors linked to our science curriculum including Sir David Attenborough, Margaret Hamilton and Eva Crane.

History/Geography – As geographers, we will be exploring 'Marvellous Maps'. We will develop our understanding of the key features of maps through studying a range of maps and atlases. We will learn to use the eight compass points and give grid references to locate various places.

Computing – As consumers of technology, we will be learning about databases. We will search them and create a class database alongside designing our own avatars.

Expressive Arts

Art and Design – As food technicians, we will be exploring Global Food. We will discover where in the world certain ingredients flourish, learn about the 'Eatwell' plate and some basic cooking techniques.

Music – As musicians, we will ask the question, 'How does music teach us about our community?'. We will engage with a wide range of musical styles and sing, listen, play and compose.

Physical Development

Football – As footballers, we will focus on dribbling, passing and receiving the ball and tactical play. We will also learn the basics of goalkeeping. We will focus on the importance of fair play and being respectful to other players and the referee at all times.

Benchball – As benchballers, we will learn the fundamentals of throwing and catching, tactical play, footwork and positional awareness and playing to our team strengths.

Personal Social and Emotional Development

RE – As theologians, we will explore the question, 'How can following God bring freedom and justice?'

PSHE – As citizens, we shall be considering 'Rights and Responsibilities'. We shall explore our responsibilities at home and within our school and community. We will discuss loans, debit and credit and spending wisely and local councils and public services.
